

Army Heritage Days 2014; is Back!



The U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center (USAHEC) is excited to announce its annual Army Heritage Days Event is back this year and bigger than ever! Army Heritage Days, scheduled for May 17 & 18, 2014, is a timeline living history event, which examines nearly every era of U.S. Army history. This year's event features an expanded look at World War I and showcases living historians representing Soldiers from before the French and Indian War through the Vietnam War. After a hiatus, over 200 re-enactors from all periods are eager to return to the Army Heritage Trail to bring Army history to life once again.

Throughout the two day event, historical equipment, vehicles, gear, and live demonstrations will fill the USAHEC's Army Heritage Trail. New additions in 2014 include the unique experience of a World War I bi-plane flyover, and a two-day military music tattoo program, featuring performances of military and patriotic music by local and historical bands. While Army Heritage Days will feature exciting new programming, some favorites from the past several years will return, including the used book sale, the children's passport activity, and the meet and greet with Army veterans from WWII through current operations.

#### Orders, Communications and Bills

Department Order# 6 was read regarding the passing after her battle with cancer of Pennsylvania Department Auxiliary President Lucille Coe.

National General Order# 11 was read regarding the passing of Real Son Charles A. Cox of Indian Nation Camp# 3, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

National Special General Order# 2 was read regarding the passing of Vermont Department Past Department Commander Merlin Thomas "Tuffy" Doyle.

#### Old Business:

- 1) Brother Greg Kline discussed the difficulties in obtaining sufficient reservations to proceed with Camp 15's proposed bus trip to Arlington National Cemetery. As of the meeting, only half the needed reservations were accounted for and interest seems to have dried up. The Camp would be financially responsible for covering the cost of any shortfall in the 35 bus seats that the quote by Wolf's Bus Line was based on. - 3) The recruiting table for February 8 at the US Army Heritage Center at Carlisle was canceled. They had higher than expected table bookings and all that was still available were outdoor tables. Will need to book before January next year to ensure a space.
- 4) Camp# 15 Members are continuing to show interest in and are completing the online course for the Youth Protection Training offered online by the Boy Scouts of America. At least 4 Brothers have completed the training and one other is in the process of doing so.

Junior Vice Commander Logan Swanger will be speaking at numerous local historical societies and has sent notices to other historical groups, roundtables, etc offering to speak on the SUVCW as a recruiting opportunity.

#### Good of the Order:


Senior Vice Commander Jeff Smith announced that he will be speaking on William Tecumseh Sherman at the next Camp meeting on March 16.

## ARMY AND NAVY ITEMS

The President has commuted the sentence of the deserters heretofore condemned to death to imprisonment during the war.

The Negroes of Baltimore, Maryland, have held the first of a series of meetings for the purpose of calling the attention of the contraband to the matter of enlisting in our army.

Admiral Dahlgreen is in Washington. It is rumored that he has been relieved from the command of the ironclad fleet off Charleston. Admiral Farragut will probably be appointed to succeed him.

A commission has been appointed by the Secretary of War to visit the camps where all rebel prisoners are confined, and administer to them the oath of allegiance under the President's recent Amnesty Proclamation.

Committees from different Districts in Pennsylvania are now visiting the Army of the Potomac to offer an additional bounty of \$200 to veterans, the money to pay the same having been raised in their Districts.

Twenty five of the thirty thousand veterans of the Army of the Potomac, whose terms of service expire within the next nine months, have re-enlist.

There is a great rush of Major and Brigadier Generals out of employment for active duty to avoid the effect of the bill to dismiss such from the service.

It is estimated that the cost per man of the army is nearly if not quite \$1200 per annum.

It ought to be generally known that the Government will furnish each soldier who loses a limb in its service with another one free of expense, and take care of him while the limb is be fitted, through the medical director, New York.

A traveling wagon for the Adjutant-General's Department of the Cumberland has just been completed at the Government shops in Washington. It is a new invention, and accommodates seven clerks and a driver, is drawn by four horses, and can be taken apart and put together in five minutes. A similar one will be shortly completed for General Pleasanton, Army of the Potomac.

The Secretary of War has directed that no volunteer shall be rejected on account of height, who is at least five feet.

Over 12,000 Negroes have already enlisted in Tennessee. Enlistments in the middle district average 500 per week. It is said that an army of seventy five thousand Negroes will be ready for the campaign in the spring.

Major Malone, Paymaster in the United States Army was robbed, in Washington, recently of \$10,000, which he had drawn from the Treasury for the purpose of carrying to the front, in order to pay certain regiments there.

The gunboat De Soto has thus far proved herself the most successful of all the vessels on the Atlantic blockade, she has captured seventeen blockade runners.

The examination of the Congressional War Committee into the management of the battle of Gettysburg by General Meade has failed to sustain the charge that that General gave an order for his army to retreat after the first day's fight. General Warren has testified distinctly that no such order was given, and that the incidental charges against General Meade are altogether unfounded. (See March 23, 1864 in date section)

Pennsylvania Veterans NOW can obtain Veteran Status upon PA driver's license!

2014 Requirements for adding a Veterans Designation while renewing or *duplicating* your Driver's License or Identification Card (ID).

PA Governor Corbett signed Act 176 2012 into law allowing for the issuance of a Pennsylvania Driver's License or Identification Card that clearly indicates that the bearer is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces. This is being accomplished by adding a Veterans Designation directly to the bearer's Driver's License or Identification Card.



Qualified applicants for a Veterans Designation on their Driver's License or Identification Card include those who have received a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty/DD214 or equivalent for service in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or the National Guard, who were discharged or released from such service under conditions other than dishonorable.

Once the Veterans Designation has been added to your license or ID, it will automatically appear each time your license or ID is renewed.

There is no fee for the Veterans Designation; however qualified applicants must pay any initial issuance, renewal **or at \$17.00 a duplicate Driver's License or ID fees.**

Warning: Misrepresentation will result in the cancellation of your driver's license and/or identification card. Only applicants who have received form **DD 214** or equivalent for service in the United States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or the National Guard, who were discharged or released from such service under conditions *other than dishonorable*, should apply the Veterans Designation to their Driver's License or Identification Card. The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs will audit submissions to verify veteran status. Claiming veterans' status when not a veteran has serious consequences including loss of Driver's License or ID. **Please select an option below to continue:**

### Cooper's Battery B Completes Monument Capstone Replacement Project

After years of planning and fundraising, the monument capstone replacement project undertaken in 2010 on East Cemetery Hill at Gettysburg by members of Cooper's Battery B has been completed. The dedication was held at 9AM on Saturday, November 23 (Remembrance Day Weekend) 2013, and included both current members of the Battery B reenacting unit and many descendants of the original Battery members. General John F Hartranft Camp 15's Commander Scott Debo, Secretary Greg Kline, and Guide Tom Bowman are members of Cooper's Battery and took part in the ceremony.



The monument is one of the 10 oldest on the field of the Gettysburg National Military Park and is the first dedicated to an artillery unit, having been placed in August of 1879 by surviving members of Battery B. Wind, weather and time had slowly eroded the marble capstone making the Battery's war service all but illegible.



The modern day Cooper's Battery, led by its Monument Chairman Keith Foote, obtained the permission of the National Park Service and raised the needed \$10,000 to replace the worn capstone with an **exact** duplicate. The National Park Service sent the capstone to a government

lab which used laser technology to read its surface and accurately determined the original writing. This was accomplished on 5 of the capstone's 8 sides and these 5 sides were engraved on the replacement. Regrettably, 3 sides were illegible even to the laser and had to remain blank on the replacement. Old Battery B meeting minutes have not indicated what the original writing was, but we will continue to look!

Remembrance Day weekend of 2013 will always be particularly special to the members of the modern day Cooper's Battery B. As a reenacting unit we will always have the satisfaction of knowing that we helped to preserve the legacy of the original Cooper's Battery B on East Cemetery Hill and we are thankful for the pleasure of dedicating this new monument in the presence of their grandchildren and great-grandchildren!
