Hartranft, John Frederick (1830-1889) — Born in New Hanover Township, Montgomery County, Pa., December 16, 1830. A Republican, he served in the Union Army during the Civil War; was Pennsylvania state auditor general, 1866-72; then Governor of Pennsylvania, 1873-79; and candidate for Republican nomination for President, 1876. He received the Medal of Honor in 1886 for action at Bull Run, Va., July 21, 1861. The General died October 17, 1889. His Interment is at Montgomery Cemetery, Norristown, PA, which Camp 15 has visited. The General, of course, is our Camp's namesake!

Commander Kline called the meeting to order at 1404 hours. The Hartranft Camp #15 treasury contains \$1358. Two candidate petitions were read: Dennis Dewalt and Anthony Kline. Brother Deppen moved and Brother Klinepeter seconded that they be given unanimous approval. Present for induction were Thomas Bruner, Donald Messersmith, and William Neumyer. The Commander stated that all copyright paperwork for our anniversary booklet was completed and will be submitted by the end of December.

Secretary Sheibley summarized Department Order #5 from Lee F. Walters, PDC, and Department Order #1 from John M. McNulty, newly installed DC. The official minutes of the Department mid-winter and summer Encampments were made available for camp members.

Brother Houser noted his 28 October "Civil War Letters" presentation at the Halifax Historical Society.

Brother Fry mentioned the Dauphin County Heroes Grove. Brothers Klinepeter and Houser moved and seconded that Camp #15 donate \$100 for the purchase of a brick listing the camp's name.

The Linglestown Church of God wishes to remove or bury the headstones of about 200 graves near the church; three graves are of Civil War veterans. Commander Kline will meet with Carl Book from the church to discuss the matter.

The commander formed a Committee for Civil War Memorials and Preservation. Members are Brothers Bowman, Deppen, and Prye. They will look into the procedures for Civil War tombstone preservation and replacement as followed by the office of Veterans Affairs.

Brother Prye appealed for Civil War teaching materials for home-schooled children. Camp #15 will be participating in the November 22 Gettysburg Remembrance Day Parade. A springtime field trip to the Museum of Civil War Medicine is being planned by the Commander. The Senior Vice-Commander will have a slate of officers ready for the October meeting. Please see Brother Deppen if you wish to hold an office or be present at the meeting to volunteer for a position.

A motion to present SUVCW license plates to our new Department Commander at the 11 October luncheon and to our new National Commander-in-Chief at the 22 November Remembrance Day luncheon was made by Brother Klinepeter and seconded by Brother Walters and was passed.

Patriotic Instructor Klinepeter spoke of Civil War dates, the dedication of the new Gettysburg Cyclorama, "Clip-a-Coupon" campaign for families of American soldiers in Iraq, decks of cards showing looted Iraqi artifacts, and the 50th Anniversary of the Harrisburg Civil War Roundtable.

Brother Walters, while PA Department Commander, had written to the staff at the Gettysburg Cyclorama at the new Visitors Center to offer assistance at the Grand Opening Ceremonies. They replied that they needed no help.

The Commander closed the meeting at 1535 hours.

PATRIOTIC INSTRUCTOR/GAR HISTORIAN

In the October 2008 issue of my American Rifleman I read an interesting article about the 2nd amendment to the Constitution, "the right to bear arms". On April 19, 1775, American colonists took up their muskets to defend their rights and freedom. But what happened after Lexington and Concord, the wholesale confiscation of firearms from the people of Boston, played a major role in determining the Founders' Second Amendment. Bostonians surrendered their arms at Fanell Hall in response to British General Gage's demand they be turned in and "at a suitable time would be returned to their owners."of course, they weren't returned". On October 13, 1775 the United States Navy was established and on November 10, 1775 the United States Marine corps was established.

November 11 was originally set aside as Armistice Day, honoring those who served in the War to end all Wars, now known as World War 1. This date has been changed to now honor all Veterans of all wars.

November 11 1865 This year is the 143rd anniversary of the closing of Camp Curtin. It was the largest training camp in the North. Over 300,000 men went through there during the war, many did not return. It was used as a training grounds, hospital, major supply base, prisoner of war camp. I recommend reading "The Training of an Army" (Camp Curtin and the North's Civil War) by William J. Miller.

November 11, 1990 the 125th anniversary of the closing of Camp Curtin. I was asked to portray Governor Andrew Gregg Curtin for this ceremony. It has been my privilege to continue portraying Governor Curtin to this day. His was a very important and interesting life.

November 19, 2008 145th Anniversary of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address at the National Cemetery in Gettysburg. Main speaker will be Ken Burns, James

Getty will portray President Lincoln and David Klinepeter will portray Ward Lamon introducing the President. Lamon was also Lincoln's body guard, chief marshal of the parade, in charge of security and master of ceremonies. --- DJK

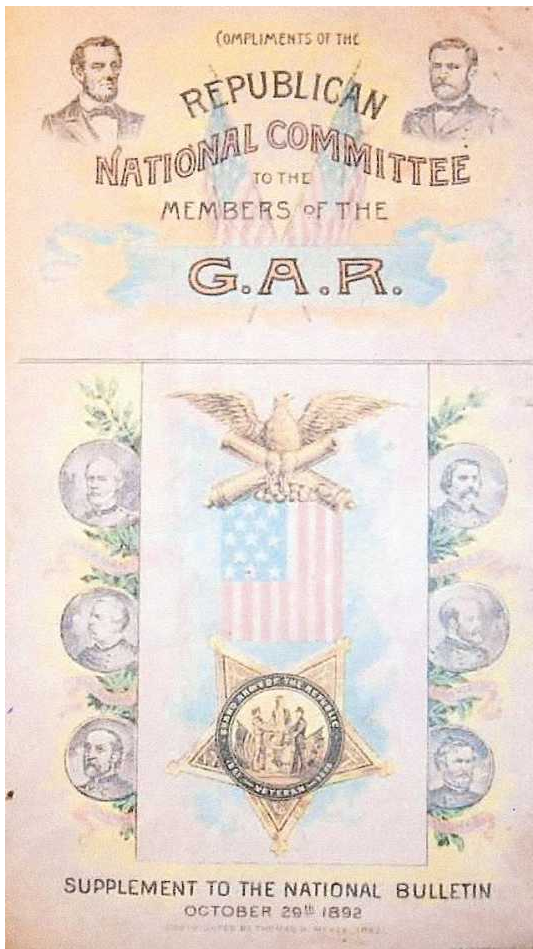

| GAR | Grand Army of the Republic |
| Allied Orders | During its existence the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) was aided in its work by five organizations, known as the Allied Orders* of the GAR. |
| Order | Any one of the 5 Allied Orders of the GAR |
| SUVCW | Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. |
| Sons | Another name for us – the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War |
| Brother | A male who is either a Member, Associate, Junior, Honorary Member or Life Member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War |
| Sister | A member of the other Allied Orders – LRC, LGAR, Daughters, Auxiliary |
| ASUVCW | Auxiliary to the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War |
| Camp | Local organization of the Sons |
| Department | A state or alliance of states of the United States of America formed to peruse local camps within its purview; eg: Department of Pennsylvania |
| WRC | Woman's Relief Corps |
| LGAR | Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic |
| DUVCW | Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War |
| CC | Camp Commander – elected leader of a camp |
| PCC | Past Camp Commander |
| DC | Department Commander – elected state leader |
| PDC | Past Department Commander |
| CinC | Commander in Chief – elected national leader of SUVCW |
| PCinC | Past Commander in Chief |
| Rituals | A series of activities for opening, closing and operating the meetings and Encampments of the Order |
| Encampment | (A convention of) The official body of the National Organization of each of the Allied Orders and of their Departments |
| BIGS | Brother(s) in Good Standing with our Order |
| FCL | Fraternity, Charity, and Loyalty - The principles upon which the Grand Army of the Republic and its Allied Orders were founded, and under which the Allied Order currently operate |
