"No Statues Honoring Civil War's African American Fighting Men"

Over 150 years ago, almost 11,000 Black soldiers trained with their white officers at Camp William Penn, which was said to be the first and largest training center for United States Colored Troops in the North. However, due to the negative political and racial climate in Philadelphia, the camp would be located north of the city on welcoming Quaker land, owned by the family of the abolitionist Lucretia Mott, in Cheltenham Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

These troops would become an **integral** part of the estimated **215,000 Black soldiers and sailors** who would serve as the pivotal factor in the North's victory over the Confederate forces. As many as **38,000** of these men would perish in what was America's most horrendous conflict. **Sadly**, among the many Civil War statuary that grace the Philadelphia area, there is yet to be a single uniformed figural statue honoring their historic sacrifice, valor and heroism.
