photographer located, Franville, NY


Concern: type of hat and uniform?

Answer: 1880-1890's military style hat of SUVCW as

national guard to the federal military.

During WWII, the men were all called up for duty in the big war and the post office nearly came to a close with most of their employees off to war. The Ladies of the town, like women of many towns, jumped on the band wagon and continued the duties left behind by the fighting men.

If the horse's four feet are on the ground, the rider died a natural death. If the horse has one front leg in the air, the rider was wounded in action. If both forefeet are in the air, the rider died in battle.





2019 CEREMONY FOR LINCOLN GETTYSBURG ADDRESS

Scheduled for November 19, 2019

Being a Life Member of the Lincoln Fellowship, I received this communication:

With summer waning our thoughts turn toward the fall and our annual Decoration Day ceremony. I write to invite you to this year's event on Tuesday November 19. To celebrate the 156 th anniversary of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address. I am pleased to announce the keynote speaker will be Michael Beschloss. He is an award-winning presidential historian, scholar of leadership, and bestselling author of ten books.

The ceremonies begin at the Soldiers' National Cemetery with a wreath laying at 10:15 a m. adjacent to the Soldiers' National Monument. The formal Dedication Day program follows at the rostrum beginning at 10:30 a.m. A limited number of seats are available so feel free to bring lawn chairs. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held at Gettysburg College's Majestic Theater located at 25 Carlisle Street.



Researching Your Civil War Ancestors

People often come to The National Civil War Museum hoping to find more information about a Civil War soldier ancestor. Many have the notion that there is a roll of names that we can access. Such a list would be very unwieldy, even in the age of digital data, as nearly 2 million served the Union and 750,000 served the Confederate armies. Simply imagine the number of John Smiths that might appear on such a list.

After the war, many states compiled lists of soldiers that served in the Civil War, transferring the information from original muster rolls to card files and documents—mostly done under the auspices of the states' adjutant general's office. The finished works were often multivolume book series published by the states which contained names of soldiers and officers, basic service details, and even brief unit itineraries and histories. In some cases, these have been digitized and may be available for free online. However, they still provide very limited information.

Veterans' and regimental organizations wrote unit or regimental histories, often of book-length, providing detailed narratives or personal reminiscences of their wartime experiences. This genre of Civil War nonfiction is still popular today. These books can contain photographs, biographical sketches, or detailed rosters of the unit's participants.

Many researchers find success in the Compiled Service Records (CMSR) of soldiers and in the soldier's pension or widow's pension record. If you're up for an adventure, you can visit The National Archives and Records Administration in Washington, D.C. where you can make copies of documents on file for a small fee.

When you inquire at The National Civil War Museum, we use a combination of paid and free online databases to provide information. The American Civil War Research Database at: www.civilwardata.com offers annual subscriptions that are very reasonably priced. Much of their data is gathered from state rosters and publications. Similar, but less detailed information, can be found in the free Civil War Soldiers and Sailors System, which is managed by The National Park Service and can be found at: www.itd.nps.gov/cwss/

The Museum also subscribes to www.Fold3.com a subscription database of military records managed by Ancestry.com. Users have access to an ever-growing resource including, but not limited to, Compiled Service Records, Index Cards, Pension File Index Cards, and full Widow's Pensions. The index cards found here contain valuable information and numbers that can help a researcher locate more detailed service records, medical records, and pension records at The National Archives and Records Administration in Washington, D.C.

Lastly, The National Civil War Museum's staff may turn to a free, online database called www.findagrave.com to locate the grave of a Civil War soldier or sailor. This site may provide biographical, genealogical, or vital information. Find-A-Grave is very popular among researchers as they often post photographs or obituaries.

A visit to The National Civil War Museum can often provide valuable leads to get you started. We are happy to help our members to fill in missing information, but we ask that you continue the investigation on your own. Public libraries, churches and hometown government can provide newspaper articles, obituaries and other archival documents to help you complete your search. Happy Hunting!



Constellation of days gone!

Ezra S. Conner served in the Navy from Penobscot during the War Between the States. (- "History of Castine - The Battle Line of Four Nations," George A. Wheeler [Second Edition; Cornwall, NY: The Cornwall Press, 1922], list opposite Appendix.) He was a seaman, following his father to the Grand Banks as a fisherman. He married in a double ceremony with his sister, Elizabeth, at Penobscot before Justice of the Peace James Leach. His grandson Gerald reported that Ezra served on the USS Constellation. (The USS Constellation is a 22gun sloop-of-war built in 1854. During the Civil War [when Ezra was aboard], the USS Constellation was assigned to the Mediterranean Sea where it showed the flag, maintained foreign relations, and protected American commerce. In late 1864, the ship was briefly sent to the Gulf of Mexico. Upon arriving in the Gulf, it was inspected by Adm. David G. Farragut who ordered the ship to return to Norfolk. The USS Constellation is the last all sail warship built for the US Navy, and the last vessel active in the Civil War still afloat. The ship's launching was commemorated on a US postage stamp issued 29 June 2004.) His pension record states he also served on the USS Ohio and the USS St. Lawrence.

Ezra served on the USS Ohio 3 Feb 1862 to 26 Feb 1862 - the receiving ship at Boston while he awaited assignment to an active vessel. After his service on the USS Constellation, he served on the USS St. Lawrence 26 Jan 1865 to 3 Feb 1865, an ordnance ship at Norfolk, while awaiting expiration of his enlistment.

Via email 26 Aug 2003 from Kennedy Hickman (khickman@constellation.org): "Our records, which are taken from the US Navy muster rolls for the ship, show that an E.S. Connor, age 20, enlisted at Castine, ME, on Feb. 2, 1862 for a term of three years. He is described as having blue eyes, brown hair, a ruddy complexion, and standing 5'5". He was given the rating of ordinary seaman, meaning that he had been to sea previously either in the naval or merchant service. If you have any additional information regarding Erza Connor, I would appreciate you sharing it with us. The Museum maintains open files on all known former crewmembers, and I would like to start one on Erza Connor. If you have not already, I would suggest contacting the National Archives in regards to any records

they might have regarding Erza Connor. Simple instructions for obtaining naval records may be found at http://www.history.navy.mil/faqs/faq19-1.htm. If you have any questions regarding the ship, please feel free to drop me a line. Best wishes, Ken Hickman. Curator/Historian, USS Constellation Museum (Pier 1, 301 E. Pratt Street, Baltimore, MD 21202-3134 - http://www.constellation.org)."

His obituary reports: "Capt. Ezra Conner, after a long illness, passed away at his home.... From a young man he has followed the sea, and was in the government employ for six years. His later years have been spent on vessels coasting up and down the Penobscot river. ...He was a member of Charles Stevens Post, Grand Army of the Republic.... The services were held at the Methodist church at 3 o'clock on Monday afternoon. Rev. Mr. Lowell officiated."
