

2021 October Camp 15 meeting minutes

At 2:01 pm, JVC brother Logan opened the meeting, following the official R&C.

- 1. Brothers and sisters in distress or illness were briefly discussed including Mrs. Bill Jackson, Vern Stout, Jeff Smith, Lee Walters and Dave Klinepeter!
- 2. Brother Treasurer offered September and October expenditures for annual Domain Name fee; monthly internet host fee; and postage for October newsletter providing a checkbook balance of \$630. Report accepted and approved.
- 3. Minutes of September Meeting read and approved.
- 4. Camp welcomed new brother David Morrison, who transferred from Lancaster camp upon relocating to a retirement community at E-town. Brother Dave discussed his ancestors and his background prior to retirement! He also mentioned his desire to visit the Lincoln Cemetery on South 30th Street in Penbrook, just next door to Reservoir Park Harrisburg. Welcome to another brother *Dave* among our patriot brotherhood.
- 5. Beginning in 2003, the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) embarked on the Last Soldier Project. The purpose of the project is to locate and appropriately mark the final resting place of the last Civil War Soldier buried in each county/parish and in each state of this great country.

Brother Logan discussed the very recent event by our sister camp 503 of Sunbury upon their recent tribute to the *Last Civil War Veteran* of Northumberland County. Camp 503 revealed they intend to pay tribute to other *last veterans* in adjacent counties!





6. Camp 15 welcomed brother Duke Hall, a US Army Veteran, home from his latest deployment. Duke is now assigned to Fort Irwin. Duke is grandson of PDC and brother of camp 15, Lee Walters. Brother Lee is also a retired SUVCW National Executive Director 2000 – 2008.

Patriotic Instructor hour:

Brother Wayne Blattner shared with Camp 15 recent Civil War two seminars he had attended in the past month.

The first one he attended was held in the Richmond Virginia area, and was headquartered at Homewood Suites Hotel near the Airport. The dates were from September 28 to October 2, 2021. Woodbury Historical Tours sponsored the seminar titled "Grant vs. Lee, The Overland Campaign of 1864" For the next five days noted author Mr. Gordon Rhea as our guide, we covered the battles of the Wilderness, Spotsylvania Court House, Yellow Tavern, North Anna River, Cold Harbor, and the opening of the Petersburg Campaign. Also included were visit to various "off the beaten path" locations such as local farms and homesteads that Mr. Rhea had made arrangements with the owners for our group to tour their buildings and lands. These were areas that the typical visitor could not gain access to. One location was Massaponax Church, where Grant, Meade, and Burnside halted briefly in route to Guinea Station and North Anna River, as the Union chased Lee south. Provided as part of the tour was a booklet of great **color** maps of troop movements at each location we visited. Woodbury Tours rented a large tour bus, so with only around 24 of us, each person had their own seat with plenty of room! I had a great time, especially at the Spotsylvania Battlefield. Gordon took time to show where the sixth Corps was located both on May 10th and May 12th, 1864. My Great-Great Grandfather (95th PVI), was wounded on the 12th at the Bloody Angle being part of Upton's Brigade. The lunch's that were provided while we toured were great too!

The second seminar he attended was held near the Antietam battlefield sponsored by a brand-new organization titled "The Antietam Institute 1862". The dates were from noon Friday October 15th to noon October 17, 2021. This organizations web site is www.antietaminstitute.org Check it out for the up incoming programs and merchandise. Their Facebook page has photos of this weekend. This event was headquartered at The Shepherd's Spring Retreat Center, located on 16869 Taylors Landing Road (Sharpsburg). They provided excellent meals and sufficient meeting rooms.

The goal as stated from their membership pamphlet is" The Antietam Institute sponsors conferences, symposiums, publications, leadership forums, and other activities facilitate collaborative learning and knowledge exchange, for discovery and inspire further historical research". Quite a goal!

For their 2021 Fall Conference the subject was "New Perspectives on Antietam: Command Decisions. Friday afternoon there were three in house talks from various authors. This was followed by a fine dinner. The evening concluded with an open panel discussion.

The conference included three battlefield walks, and handouts with color maps. The first walk on Saturday morning focused on activity at the Middle Bridge dealing with the Fitz John Porter's Fifth

Corps, and Alford Pleasonton's Cavalry operations in that area. The afternoon walk addressed activity at the Lower Bridge commonly called "Burnside's Bridge". Sunday morning's venture focused on the North Woods area and what happened here in the early morning of September 17, 1862 which was the start of the battle.

There was a Saturday evening dinner that included a Key Note Speaker, Mr. Dennis Frye. For nearly 50 years Dennis has been leading tours, lecturing, and writing about Antietam and Harpers Ferry. He had an excellent presentation.

This organization has already published two books. One is titled "Antietam Journal", and the other called "The Brigades of Antietam".

C&R Article II Membership

Section 3 (a). A Brother whose dues are not paid by March 1 may be dropped for nonpayment of dues by a vote of the Camp. A Brother so dropped shall not be admitted to another Camp or membership-atlarge unless having received the concurrence of the Camp which dropped him.

A Brother so dropped from the rolls of a Camp shall be issued a General Discharge for the Good of the Order. ²⁴ A Brother may be reinstated by paying the current year's dues [camp and department] plus a [national] reinstatement fee of ten dollars (\$10.00)! To become a National Life Member of our grand organization, visit national website www.suvcw.org choose forms, select forms. Save it to your computer, open newly saved form, complete it, save it, and attach your payment for your age bracket and mail directly to national headquarters!
