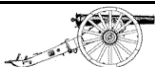

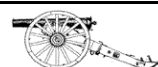

## Hartranft deceased in October

[John F. Hartranft \(1830 – 1889\)](#) served as Governor of Pennsylvania, 1872-1879. Born in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania in 1830, having served local militia, he raised a regiment of Montgomery County militia in April of 1861 to serve in the Civil War. Hartranft was later named Colonel of the 51st Regiment Volunteer Infantry, participating in several major battles, and rose to the rank of Brigadier General. Following the Civil War, Hartranft was appointed Special Provost Marshall, and given responsibility for the care and final execution of the conspirators convicted in the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln.

Later, Hartranft became Auditor General of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 1865 and, served two terms. Thereafter he was elected Governor of Commonwealth in 1872. As Governor, he was involved in the ratification of a new state constitution, the Centennial of Pennsylvania, and such labor issues as railroad strikes and the trials of the *Molly Maguires*.

Following his years as governor, Hartranft was active in various organizations, and was appointed Major General over the Pennsylvania National Guard.

The General, Camp 15's namesake, died on October 17, 1889.

### Dues for 2023

The 2022 national encampment at Grand Rapids, MI, voted effective January 1, 2023, the National Per Capita will increase from \$23.00/year to \$33.00/year. Note, this is the first increase in twelve years; it is worth 2 visits to your favorite coffee shop. Bylaws may need to be reviewed and camp dues chart needs to be reviewed and updated accordingly. At our October Camp meeting we will need to *declare* the camp dues for 2023, including the camp's needs, PA Department dues and the increase of the National Per Capita [dues].

Also, any camp or department that is licensed by National to sell variety of items, needs to have their license renewed every 2 years. At a recent CofA meeting the subject was not discussed and later when brought to the attention of the Council of Administration, it was decided all licensees have been extended for another year due to the clerical error. Therefore Camp 15's 2 licenses are good into 2023.

Treasurer's report was presented revealing financial transactions since Spring meeting resulting in a current balance of \$499 in checking account. Otherwise, Camp's investments continue to march forward with current interest rates. The next expenditure will be the monthly internet fee. Treasurer David Demmy presented the contract from our cater for our forthcoming holiday banquet in December, revealing a steady inflation increase over the last several years. 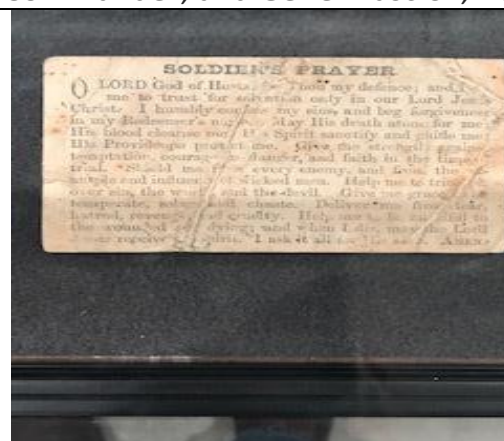

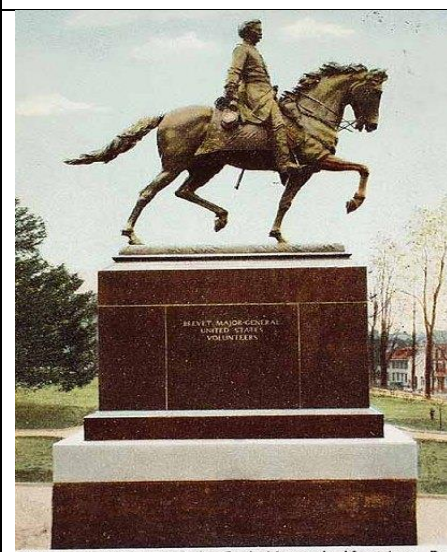



9:15 AM	<b>Life Lessons with General Ulysses S Grant as portrayed by Kenneth Serfass</b> When you sit down with US Grant, you will be encouraged to openly discuss the life lessons that formed the most successful general in our history, and a man who was admired in his own time even more than Abraham Lincoln. General Grant will tell you how his reactions and decisions as a boy and young officer shaped the man he is, and how those same experiences are all part of a greater destiny than any of us could decide for ourselves to lead a "safe and good" life.		
10:15 AM	<b>Dr. Timothy B. Smith, "The Design Was Always Mine": US Grant and the Vicksburg Campaign</b> For nearly nine months, Ulysses S. Grant tried repeatedly to capture the Confederate river city of Vicksburg, Mississippi. He maneuvered and adapted numerous times, reacting to events and enemy movements with great skill and finesse as the lengthy campaign played out on a huge chessboard, dwarfing operations in the east. This reexamination of the familiar story is organized around Grant's eight key decisions during the campaign. Grant's nontraditional choices went against the accepted theories of war, supply, and operations as well as against the chief thinkers of the day, such as Henry Halleck, Grant's superior. Yet Grant pulled off the victory in compelling fashion. Smith shows how Grant's decisions created and won the Civil War's most brilliant, complex, decisive, and lengthy campaign.	2:15 PM	<b>Mallory Howard and Steve Courtney, Mark Twain, the General, and Mark Twain's Best Friend: The Drama of Grant's Last Years</b> Mark Twain helped restore Grant's fortunes at the very end of his life, as the publisher of the general's memoirs. "This is the simple soldier," Twain later wrote, "who, all untaught of the silken phrase makers, linked words together with an art surpassing the art of the schools, and put into them a something which will still bring to American ears, as long as America shall last, the roll of his vanished drums and the tread of the marching hosts." Grant finished the job in excruciating pain from throat cancer, and died shortly afterward, but sales of the memoirs saved his wife, Julia Grant, from poverty. And Twain's best friend, Rev. Joseph Twichell, a minister from Hartford who had served under Grant, was always loyal to his old commander -- and that loyalty led to a dramatic protest against honoring Grant's opponent Lee, interrupting an 1896 ceremony at Yale University, an action that foreshadows recent removals of Confederate monuments.

Dr. Mackowski is employed as a Professor of Communication and the Jandoli School Associate Dean of Undergraduate Programs at St. Bonaventure University. Dr. Mackowski has authored or co-authored nearly two dozen books and edited a half-dozen essay collections on the Civil War. He was tasked with encouraging sectional healing after the American Civil War, promoting the growth of national industry, resolving tensions between the military and various Indigenous Tribes in the West, and restoring the nation's reputation abroad. In this presentation, Park Ranger Nick Sacco (Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site) will examine Grant's responses to these various complicated problems. While Grant had mixed success in addressing these issues and was plagued by scandals within his administration (both real and perceived), this presentation will stress how the nation's eighteenth president oversaw a growing nation in transition towards becoming a world power.
