



Old Business:

Brother Logan opened the meeting at 2:10 PM in the fashion of the SUVCW ritual.

Brother David read the minutes from January meeting. Motion to accept was approved.

Brother David continued with the Treasurer report mentioning few office expenses and postage to mail our monthly newsletter, *The Hartranft Herald*.

Report was offered on collection of 2023 dues to date with 70% participation. 11 brothers' dues are still outstanding.

Brother Greg, camp secy is completing form 22 for submission to PA Dept secy. Next documentation required to be completed by our camp is form 27 itemizing personnel strength and remittance of dues for 2023.

Motion to accept the report was approved.

Visitation:

Brothers Wayne and David offered discussion of the annual PA dept Lincoln Luncheon hosted by our sister camp in Sunbury. The affair was held in the charming former Railroad Station in Northumberland. Brother Wayne will be offering photos later in this March issue of *Hartranft Herald*.

New Business:

Brother David spoke upon a display of cigar boxes^{*} embellished with likeness of **Maj Gen John F. Hartranft**. One box was offered to the camp from our national *Banner* editor, another box was purchased from eBay long ago and the most recent box was provided to the camp by *Dave Klinepeter's* Knapp's Battery cohort, **Charlie Oellig** of Linglestown, PA. Charlie is the current curator of the PA 28th Division Museum, at Fort Indiantown Gap. The photos on display revealed gunners of the reenactment battery of long ago. This 3rd box was wooden and square shaped. *Photos later in this issue; check out caption of names.* After a brief discussion on potential field trips to Delaware and Gettysburg area, namely the Eisenhower Farm Estate, the brothers decided to postpone further comments for our March meeting.

Also, we mentioned we need to conduct a tribute for the Last Veteran ceremony later this year in Perry County, just across the river from Harrisburg.

Brother Logan discussed his latest adventures in local cemeteries accumulating data from text on variety of veteran tombstones.

Meeting concluded with ritual and camp closed by Brother Logan at 3:40 pm. Brothers adjourned to local restaurant for continued fellowship.

* A box/container have been used to pack premium and or handmade cigars. Cuba's H. Upmann brand deserves credits to initiate packaging cigars in boxes in the early 18th century. To get an accurate count of cigars and sales for tax collection purposes, cigars needed to be packed in wooden boxes in batches of 25, 50, 100, or 250 cigars. Cigar boxes are traditionally made from wood (mainly Spanish cedar), but tin, cardboard, and even plastic have been used as alternative materials.

A cigar box is a container used for packaging a cigar; it is mainly a part of the cigar accessory. By tradition, a cigar box is made out of cardboard, wood, or paper. Spanish cedar is the 'best' kind of wood for cigar boxes because of its pleasant odor, beautiful grain, ability to keep bugs out, and delicate texture. Yellow Poplar and Eucalyptus are used as popular substitutes, and sometimes it's scented or even stained to resemble the Spanish Cedar. Other characteristic woods used to make for cigar boxes include White Oak, Mahogany, and Elm. Circassia, Rosewood, and Basswood are among the lesser-known woods used to manufacture cigar boxes.

Many cigar companies such as the C Bair and Sons company of Harrisburg PA covered their cigar boxes in colorful images of famous individuals such as John F Hartranft.




Recent Lincoln Luncheon hosted by camp 503

The 160th Anniversary of The Shelling of Carlisle One of the most harrowing events in the town's long and memorable history. To commemorate the event Historic Carlisle Inc. is hosting a one day only

reenactment on Saturday June 10th, 2023. We are proudly partnered with such organizations as The Sons of Union Veterans of The Civil War, Benchfield Farms, Downtown Carlisle Association, Create-A-Palooza, The National Civil War Museum, Carlisle Theatre, Cumberland County Historical Society, just to name a few!

The action packed day will begin at 10am on W. High Street in the middle of the beautiful downtown Historic District. Hear the lively airs of Civil War songs, just as the soldiers would have heard, played by the Carlisle Brass Band.

Kids will have the opportunity to enlist in the PA Militia and be instructed in the drill and tactics of a Civil War soldier.

As part of Historic Carlisle's Civil War Building Plaque program there will be a walking tour with unveilings of new plaques that have been placed on High Street with a short history of each location.

Well known and accomplished authors on The Civil War and The Cumberland Valley; Cooper Wingert, Jim Schmick, and Scott Mingus will be on hand for book signings and presentations.

See artifacts that pertain to Carlisle's rich history on display at the Cumberland County Historical Society and on the street at The National Civil War Museum's display tent. Military demonstrations will include Artillery, Infantry, Medical, and a 19th Century Saber and Bayonet Drill.

At 3pm the Reenactment of The Shelling of Carlisle will commence!

Watch first hand as Confederate troops enter the town and demand supplies from the citizens. Union troops recapture the town and are forced to stave off a bombardment from enemy artillery. Feel the cannons roar as shells fly overhead and crash into the streets of town. Hear stories of the civilians and soldiers who lived through those turbulent days of 1863.

At the conclusion of the reenactment, at 5pm, the Sons of Union Veterans will be hosting a ceremony at the Civil War Monument on the Square to honor the brave souls from Cumberland County who gave their all for the Union.

To wrap up the evening there will be a showing of the Director's Cut of the film "Gettysburg" in the historic Carlisle Theatre at 7:30pm.

The daylong event is free to the public and has something for everyone of all ages.
